4. THE JEWISH VICTORIAN: Genealogical Information from Jewish Newspapers 1871 – 1880. [Transcribed and edited by Doreen Berger]

This has recently been published in England. Doreen is a founder member of the Jewish Genealogical Society of Great Britain and writes regularly on stories from the Jewish Newspapers of the past. She is a contributor to the new Dictionary of National Biography to be published by Oxford University Press.

This publication of 600 pages covers more than 20,000 entries and incorporates genealogical cross-referencing, narratives from Jewish newspapers including contemporary accounts of events and communal achievements.

5. A LETTER FROM PERTH dated 10 March 1830

Neville Milston has provided us with a copy of letter dated 10 March 1830 that was sent by Elizabeth Shaw to her friend Mrs Anne Waghome in England. Together with her husband and family, Elizabeth was a settler on the Swan River, Western Australia arriving shortly after the proclamation of the Colony in 1829 by Captain James Stirling.

The letter is printed in "My Dear, Dear Betsy" A Treasury of Australian Letters compiled by Warwick Hirst, published by Hale and Iremonger, Sydney 1993. It is about 1400 words and contains disparaging references to Jews including the following:

The fact is simply this, all the land that is good for anything and that is but a small patch here and there is kept as Government reserves and what land is given, is given to Jews, Stockbrokers, men of war's men etc.etc.

6. A PRESENTATION SILVER TROPHY TO GEORGE RAPHAEL of the Sydney Synagogue 1 January 1859

Alan Landis recently alerted us to the presence in Sydney of a substantial presentation silver cup to George Raphael that he had been asked to inspect. Its inscription is as follows:

Presented to Joseph George Raphael Esq. By his friends Members of the Sydney Synagogue for his valuable and unremitting services as treasurer during the period of three years he held that Office, Sydney 1 January 1859.

Raphael subsequently left to become Treasurer for the breakaway Macquarie Street Synagogue formed in 1859.

7. Geelong's Person of the Millenium

On 1 January 2000, the *Geelong Advertiser* announced that Henry Higgins (the presiding officer in Harvester minimum wage case) had been selected as Geelong's person of the millennium.

The newspaper's choice came from a listing of 50 people who were considered by a panel to have made significant contributions to Geelong and the wider community. The list includes the opera singer Majorie Lawrence, the silversmith Stuart Devlin, the editor of the Bulletin magazine J.F. Archibald, the long distance runner John Landy, and Cr Zillah Cawcours (my aunt) whose role as a pioneer of women in local government has been briefly printed in this newsletter.

8. The Death of Hilda Zinner OBE

It is with great sadness that we record the passing of this remarkable woman who was rightly described as a heroine in the obituary notice that appeared in the Sydney Morning Herald. She is greatly missed by those of us privileged to know her.
